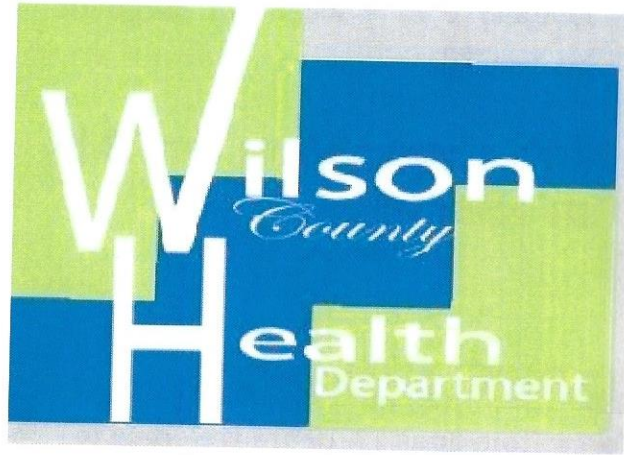


WCHD'S TEEN CLINIC

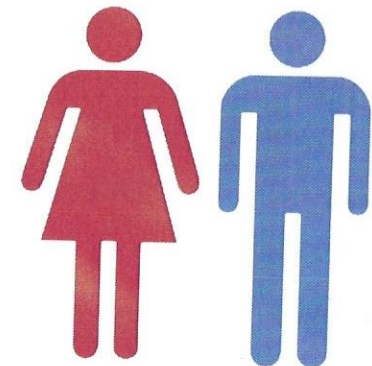

INFORMATION ABOUT OUR TEEN CLINIC

The Teen Clinic program started in March 2017, offering reproductive health services to teens ages 13-19. The goal of this program is to educate teens and their families about family planning services that are provided.

In our clinic, teens will be able to come in and meet with a nurse and a health educator to receive educational services. After meeting with them, the teen will then be able to see the provider for their exam. Our teen clinic is offered to **both** male and female teens.

All appointments are confidential, but we do encourage family participation.

Facts About Reproductive Health

- 1 in 2 sexually active young people will get an STD by age 25 (most won't know it)
- Roughly 1 in 4 teens get pregnant by age 20
- About 1 out of 8 teens ages 18-19 are having sex

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

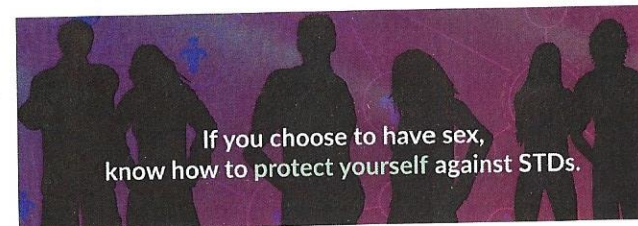
Teens from ages 13-19 are welcome to schedule a confidential appointment.

All charges are subjected to Federal Poverty Level Sliding Fee Scale with the ability to slide down to zero.
